



Romans 1:19-20





Romans 2:14-15



We believe that there is one God, eternally existing in three separate yet equal persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.


The Trinity



Why does the Trinity matter?

1. It is essential for the gospel

2. It is the source of real love



"Love is something that one person has for another person. If God was a single person, then before the world was made, He was not love. [Christians] believe that the living, dynamic activity of love has been going on in God forever and has created everything else.
